Her visionary leadership, extensive experience, and infectious enthusiasm have inspired new and veteran members alike.

Standing Rules of The Convention

- 1. Delegates will please turn off cell phones or place them in silent mode during all functions.
- 2. Delegates will mute their microphone until ask to unmute them.
- 3. Delegates will please be prompt, being in your seats at the hour for beginning the meeting.
- 4. A delegate wishing to speak, shall raise her hand, address the chair and give her name and the name and the location of her club.
- 5. No delegate shall speak more than twice to a question; the second opportunity being granted only after every other delegate desiring the floor for the first time has spoken.
- 6. Debate shall be limited to two minutes per person. Extension of time may be granted by a two-thirds vote of the voting delegates present and voting.
- 7. Speakers shall adhere to the time limits.
- 8. All motions from the floor shall be presented to the Recording Secretary in writing when so required by the chair.
- 9. Resolutions and recommendations shall be in the hands of the respective committees at the opening of the morning meetings.
- 10. A resolution or recommendation cannot be debated until it has been referred to the proper committee and reported by that committee. No resolution can be voted upon until it has been read twice. A resolution with a minority report can be passed only by a majority of the convention.
- 11. A motion shall be carried by the majority vote of the voting delegates present and voting, except that a motion requiring a two-thirds vote shall be carried by a two-thirds affirmative vote of those present and voting.
- 12. The right to the floor may be granted to non-voting delegate members by the chair.
- 13. All questions concerning those entitled to vote shall be referred to the Credentials Committee.
- 14. The Convention shall be one meeting, recessing from session to session within the meeting.
- 15. Reports shall be filed with the Recording Secretary.
- 16. The President shall appoint a Reading Committee to approve minutes of the entire Convention.
- 17. These rules shall be adopted or suspended by a majority vote, rescinded by a two-thirds vote of those present and voting, a quorum being necessary.

Also included in the Club Manual are contest rules, tips for winning entries, and judging criteria.

GFWC Jennie Award

The GFWC Jennie Award is named in honor of GFWC's founder, Jane Cunningham Croly, who wrote for national newspapers under the pseudonym "Jennie June." The award is an occasion to highlight extraordinary clubwomen who epitomize Jennie's spirit of independence, courage, and persistence through their roles as volunteers within their clubs, representatives of their community, and as members of a family or extended family. Club members are nominated by their clubs to compete at state, regional, and national levels for the Federation's highest honor.

Community Impact Program Award

The GFWC Community Impact Program Award offers GFWC clubs financial incentive to implement projects designed to impact a specific problem in their community. This award provides a vision for the future of the relationship between clubs and their communities.
